## HUMAN SERVICES A.A.S. - ASSOCIATE IN APPLIED SCIENCE DEGREE PROGRAM (CAREER-ORIENTED)

### Program Description

Students who complete this program earn an Associate in Applied Science degree as well as the certificate in Direct Care Practice. The program is sufficiently comprehensive to qualify graduates for a variety of entry-level positions in public and private sector human service agencies. Depending on personal interests and career plans, students in this program may elect specialized courses and supervised field work in the areas of family and children's services, developmental disabilities, mental health treatment, crisis intervention, and gerontology.

### Employment Potential

Successful graduates of the program are qualified for such positions as case aide in family and children's services, probation assistant, income eligibility examiner, teacher's aide, and child care worker in residential facilities. Graduates may also assist in nursery schools, child and adult daycare centers, and after-school programs. Other possible positions may be as group leaders and recreational counselors in mental health agencies, elder care, family planning, HIV and AIDS prevention services, and residential treatment programs for youth.

Graduates of this program who then earn a baccalaureate or higher degree will be qualified for positions of increased scope and responsibility, including supervisory and administrative positions in such fields as social work, counseling, education, and mental health.
