National External Diploma Program (NEDP) may be for you. NEDP provides a flexible high school completion option, read below to learn how.

NEDP provides a pathway for adults to earn their high school diploma. NEDP awards a traditional high school diploma accepted by employers, colleges, the U.S. military, and other organizations. As a competency-based assessment system, NEDP is different from the TASC™ or GED®.

NEDP offers participants:

- Self-paced and individualized flexible scheduling with no formal classes
- Effective private sessions to demonstrate competencies
- Contains electronic portfolio for scoring and tracking
- Ongoing personal counseling

WHAT IS THE NEW NATIONAL EXTERNAL DIPLOMA PROGRAM (NEDP)?

The NEDP is a high school diploma program for adults over 18 years old who can demonstrate their academic skills in an applied performance process. HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY

The SUNY Ulster program has a structured and continuous curriculum with specific student goals designed for individual success. Registration is required.

SU HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY - TASC™ I

This course is a comprehensive review for students wanting to receive their High School Equivalency Diploma. Students will prepare to take the Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASC™). This test replaced the GED® test for New York State in 2014. The focus of the classes will be on reading/writing, science, social studies, and, mathematics. TASC™ testing is determined by pre-test scores and instructor recommendation. Students may require more than one session of preparation prior to testing. This class will include homework. Students should bring notebook and pen/pencil. The required book for this course is *Kaplan's New TASC™ with two Practice Tests*. (2017) **Instructor: J. Dayton-Wolf**
